II. **MEDICAL CARE**

A. **Emergency Procedures**

1. In case of an emergency on-campus dial **33333**. In case of an emergency off-campus at seminary housing on Burton Street call **911** and also call the college security office at **526-6000** to tell them the nature of the emergency. They can send someone immediately to assist you and will assist the emergency vehicle with finding the correct apartment. Those students living at the Englewood (Stremler) Apts. or Boerema Townhouses should call **911**.
2. If possible send someone else in your building outside to guide the emergency vehicle to the correct apartment.

The closest Secretary of State office to Calvin Seminary is located at **Centerpointe Mall, 3665 28th Street SW (363-8778)**. If you have never had a driver's license, you must complete a mandatory training period before you apply for a license. The cost of a first time license is \$25.00.

 - b. Idema Food Pantry at Calvin Theological Seminary
 - 1) **What is it?**

The food pantry is a place where students who live below the poverty line can get food. The food pantry offers a variety of foods; fresh, frozen, canned or dried (meat, cereal, bread, vegetables and more). The food pantry is administered by two seminary groups - the student senate and the Dean of Students office and is run by the students.

Where is it?

The food pantry is located in the seminary basement.

3) **Who can use the food pantry?**

Most of the food is bought from Second Harvest Gleaners, and they stipulate that it may only be given to needy people. You are "needy" if you have a hard time affording basic necessities such as food, housing, heat, and adequate clothing for yourself and your family. If either you or your spouse works full time, you are probably not eligible to use the food pantry. Here are some income eligibility guidelines received from the Michigan Emergency Food Assistance Program:

4) **What do I have to do to use the food pantry?**

The food pantry is run like a coop - everyone who receives food is expected to volunteer either in staffing it or in picking up the food. There are volunteer sign-up sheets in the food pantry. Try to volunteer about one time every other month (usually for 1½ hour shifts).

5) **Who pays for the food?**

The student senate pays for the food through student senate funds, donations from the students who used the food bank, and donations from churches and other individuals. If you use the food pantry, consider how much the items would have cost in the store, and try to make a donation - even if it is just a small one, maybe \$1.00 or \$2.00. We do need contributions to keep the food pantry operating. There are donation jars at the receptionist's desk (across from the registrar's office) and in the Idema Food Pantry. This year we hope to receive additional food from churches and food suppliers in the area.

6) **What are the opening times?**

They vary from year to year. Watch the bulletin boards in the seminary for this year's times.

c. **City-wide programs**

Eastern Avenue CRC Food Distribution Program

The food distribution program is different from the food pantry. Needy families come to this program and choose from a large variety of fruits, vegetables and breads at a low cost. The cost will be approximately \$2.00 per bag or less, although quantities will be limited. Time is every Saturday morning from 10:00 a.m. to 11:30 p.m. The church opens at 7:00 a.m. to pick up a number. To volunteer, or for more information, call the church at 454-4888.

For a new telephone number call AT&T at 1-800-288-2020

You will get an automated voice, answer the questions by speaking into the phone.

When you are asked for your AT&T phone number respond “no AT&T phone” and go on from there.

Getting a telephone

You must either rent or buy your own telephone. Inexpensive phones are available at Meijer, Target, or Best Buy. Should you choose to rent a telephone, you can get one from an AT&T office.

Getting local telephone service

To order phone service, call AT&T at 1-800-288-2020. It's a good idea to order your phone as soon as you know your Grand Rapids address.

Before calling, be sure that you have at least two valid pieces of identification such as:

- ✓ Passport
- ✓ Birth certificate
- ✓ Home country identification card
- ✓ Social security number (The number is used to check your credit history; if you do not have one, explain to the operator that you are new to the country. Provide your passport number instead.)
- ✓ U.S. driver's license or official state identification card
- ✓ Calvin Seminary student ID card

AT&T may also ask you any of these general questions:

- ✓ Your names, your date of birth and your local address.
- ✓ Have you had a prior service with SBD?
- ✓ What is your social security number? (If you don't have one, tell them the type of identification you are using and they will ask for those numbers. *Hint: it is best to use your passport.*)
- ✓ What is the name, address, and telephone number of a close family member in your home country?
- ✓ Where are you employed? (If you are not employed and if you attend classes at Calvin Seminary, tell them you are a student.)
- ✓ Who will be providing your long distance service? (You do not have to know this for sure. A lot of international students do not get long distance service – they just use calling cards.)
- ✓ Do you want your number listed in the telephone book or not? (An unlisted phone number will cost extra.)
- ✓ Is there a phone number where the company can call or leave a message?
- ✓ Do you want extra options (they will cost extra) such as *call waiting* (allows you to receive other calls while you are talking on the phone), *caller ID* (displays the name and the number of the person calling you), *voice mail*

(functions like an answering machine, so people can leave you messages when you cannot answer the phone), etc.

AT&T may ask for additional information. Be prepared to fax the following to the AT&T Customer Verification Center at the number they will give you:

- ✓ Your name
- ✓ A photocopy of your passport photo page and Social Security Card (if available).
- ✓ Statement saying you are requesting telephone service in the State of Michigan.

AT&T will use this information to verify its accounts. To request service, call at least 48 hours after you have faxed this information. Tell them you have already faxed the above information to the Customer Verification Center.

Once you have completed all the necessary steps in the process, the operator will tell you your telephone number and the date it will go into effect. It usually takes 2 workdays to check references and 1-2 days to install, but it could take longer at busy times of the year.

** Remember you can change the services or plans provided by your local or long distance companies at any time, so you might want to start with the cheapest plan (e.g. no call-waiting, etc.) and then add more options later if you want them.*

Long Distance Service

Local phone service is arranged through AT&T, but long distance service is arranged separately.

Pre-paid phone cards: Most international students use pre-paid phone cards to make their long distance calls. Meijer Grocery stores, D&W and Rite-Aid in Breton Village sell these cards.

Lower Monthly Phone Bills

You may qualify for lower monthly phone bills, check <http://michigantelephone.mi.org> under *The Little Known Secret That could Slash Your Monthly Phone Bill* to find out if you qualify.

IX. SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS

The Social Security Office is located at 50 College SE, Grand Rapids. Phone: 742-2373 (www.ssa.gov)

In order to apply for a Social Security Number you must be registered in SEVIS. This cannot be done until you are officially registered as a student at Calvin Seminary AND you must have a job on campus. Once this is done you should bring the following documents with you when you apply either here on campus or at 50 College Street:

- A completed Form SS-5, Application for a Social Security Card. (A Social Security Number application form can be obtained and completed at the Social Security Office or you can get it off the web at <http://www.socialsecurity.gov/online/forms.html>.)
- Your SEVIS Form I-20 or Form DS-2019;
- Form I-94;
- At least two documents that establish your age and identity including a passport and one additional document establishing identity;
- Proof of employment authorization:
 - * A letter on Calvin Theological Seminary letterhead from the designated school official (DSO) indicating your name, your on-campus employer (e.g. Hekman Library, Calvin Seminary, Calvin Food Service, etc.), the nature of your employment (e.g. waiting tables, stocking shelves, cleaning, etc.), and it must be signed by the DSO, with their typed name, telephone number and date.
 - * A letter from the employer on the employer's letterhead that provides employment verification including:
 - identity of student employee
 - nature of job the student is, or will be, engaged in
 - anticipated or actual employment start date
 - number of hours the student is expected to work
 - employer identification number (EIN)

- employer contact information, including the telephone number and the name of the student's immediate supervisor
- original signature and signatory's title
- date
- a student who will receive or who is receiving a fellowship or assistantship in exchange for teaching or other services may present his or her letter of award or acceptance, if it outlines the stipulations of the work portion of the fellowship or assistantship.

In September Social Security personnel will be available on Calvin's campus to issue Social Security Numbers only to those who have on-campus employment. The date and time will be sent to you in an email message.

For tax purposes here in the USA, you will need either a Social Security Number or else a US Federal ID number. Applications (W-7 form) for these ID numbers can be obtained on the web at www.irs.gov.

(If you are married and Canadian, Japanese, or Korean, your wife and children will also need an ID # for income tax purposes. No other countries may claim dependants.) This W-7 form needs to be sent in along with your tax return in the spring.

Social Security Cards for Family Members

Only J-2 dependents who have received an Employment Authorization Document are eligible to apply for a social security number.

X. IMMIGRATION AND U.S.A. LEGAL STATUS

All international spouses of American citizens are eligible for permanent residency status. To get information and the correct forms you should check the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services website at www.uscis.gov and click on "immigration forms" at the top. Anyone needing assistance in this process or anyone wondering if they're eligible should contact the Dean of Students and International Student Advisor.
