II. MEDICAL CARE

A. Emergency Procedures

1. In case of an emergency on-campus dial **33333**. In case of an emergency off-campus at seminary housing on Burton Street call **911** and also call the college security office at **526-6000** to tell them the nature of the emergency. They can send someone immediately to assist you and will assist the emergency vehicle with finding the correct apartment. Those students living at the Englewood (Stremler) Apts. or Boerema Townhouses should call **911**.
2. If possible send someone else in your building outside to guide the emergency vehicle to the correct apartment.

C. **Driver’s Licenses**

Please check the Secretary of State web site at: www.michigan.gov/sos and click on “Drivers’ License & State ID” at the top left of the screen then click on “Your Michigan Driver’s License” then click on “Your first license over 18” to get the information you will need.

The closest Secretary of State office to Calvin Seminary is located at **Centerpointe Mall, 3665 28th Street SW (363-8778)**.

If you are an international student here on an F-1 or a J-1 visa you must first go to the Social Security Office at 50 College Street SE to obtain a letter from them stating that you are not eligible for a Social Security Number (SSN), unless you are working on campus and have already received a SSN. Please see the handout that was given to you during international student orientation.

The Dean of Students Office will also assist international students with the translation of their home country Driver's Licenses which is necessary in order to obtain a Michigan Driver's License.

IV. SHOPPING

A. Groceries

1. **Idema Food Pantry**, Calvin Seminary basement. Free food.

What is it?

The food pantry is a place where students who live below the poverty line can get food. The food pantry offers a variety of foods; fresh, frozen, canned or dried (meat, cereal, bread, vegetables and more). The food pantry is administered by two seminary groups - the student senate and the Dean of Students office and is run by the students.

Where is it?

The food pantry is located in the seminary basement.

Who can use the food pantry?

Most of the food is bought from Feeding America West Michigan Food Bank, and they stipulate that it may only be given to needy people. You are "needy" if you have a hard time affording basic necessities such as food, housing, heat, and adequate clothing for yourself and your family. If either you or your spouse works full time, you are probably not eligible to use the food pantry. Here are the income eligibility guidelines received from the Emergency Food Assistance Program in Michigan for 2009-2010:

What do I have to do to use the food pantry?

The food pantry is run like a coop - everyone who receives food is expected to volunteer either in staffing it or in picking up the food. You should volunteer on line at

Try to volunteer about one time every other month (usually for 1½ hour shifts).

Who pays for the food?

The student senate pays for the food through student senate funds from Calvin Theological Seminary, donations from the students who used the food bank, and donations from churches and other individuals. If you use the food pantry, consider how much the items would have cost in the store, and try to make a donation - even if it is just a small one, maybe \$1.00 or \$2.00. We do need contributions to keep the food pantry operating. There are donation jars at the receptionist's desk (across from the registrar's office) and in the Idema Food Pantry. This year we hope to receive additional food from churches and food suppliers in the area.

X. SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS

In order to apply for a Social Security Number (SSN) you must have a job on campus and be registered in SEVIS. (Please check the Social Security website <http://www.socialsecurity.gov/ssnumber/> - click on “international students” on the left side of the screen for information regarding SSN’s for international students.)

We cannot register you in SEVIS until you are officially registered as a student at Calvin Seminary. You can go in person to the Office of the Social Security Administration, 50 College Street SE, phone 742-2373. However, in September Social Security personnel will be available on Calvin’s campus to issue social security numbers only to those who have on-campus employment. The date and time will be sent to you in an email message. You will need to bring the following documents with you when you apply either here on campus or at 50 College Street:

- A completed Form SS-5, Application for a Social Security Card (you can download this form on line from the Social Security website at <http://www.socialsecurity.gov/online/forms.html>)
- Your SEVIS Form I-20 or Form DS-2019 showing your entry stamp;
- Form I-94;
- At least two documents that establish your age and identity including a passport and one additional document establishing identity (please check the web site for other forms of identity that are acceptable);
- Proof of employment authorization;

If you work for Calvin College, Karen Hollebeek, Employment Manager in Human Resources will write a letter for you which you must take along to apply for a SSN.

If you work for Calvin Seminary you will need:

A letter on Calvin Theological Seminary letterhead (please ask Jim Lakin, Plant Director or Ina De Moor in the Dean of Students office) including the following:

- identity of student employee
- nature of job the student is, or will be, engaged in
- anticipated or actual employment start date
- number of hours the student is expected to work
- employer identification number (EIN)
- employer contact information, including the telephone number and the name of the student’s immediate supervisor

- original signature and signatory's title
- date
- a student who will receive or who is receiving a fellowship or assistantship in exchange for teaching or other services may present his or her letter of award or acceptance, if it outlines the stipulations of the work portion of the fellowship or assistantship.

This letter must be signed by either Ina De Moor or Richard Sytsma and your employer here at Calvin Seminary.

For tax purposes here in the USA, you will need either a SSN or else a US Federal ID number. Applications (W-7 form) for these ID numbers can be obtained on the web at www.irs.gov. (If you are married and Canadian, Japanese, or Korean, your wife and children will also need an ID # for income tax purposes. No other countries may claim dependants.) This W-7 form needs to be sent in along with your tax return in the spring.

Only J-2 dependents who have received an Employment Authorization Document are eligible to apply for a SSN. F-2 dependents may not apply for a SSN.

NOTE: All international students who work here or receive any amount of scholarship money, tuition rebate, or housing allowance from the seminary **MUST** file income taxes here in the USA and must have either a SSN or a Federal ID Number.

Also, for income tax purposes please keep ALL text book receipts and records of gifts to U.S. charities. If you are Canadian you should also retain moving expense information for Canadian taxes.

Social Security Cards for Family Members

Only J-2 dependents who have received an Employment Authorization Document are eligible to apply for a social security number.

XI. IMMIGRATION AND U.S.A. LEGAL STATUS

All international spouses of American citizens are eligible for permanent residency status. To get information and the correct forms you should check the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services website at www.uscis.gov and click on "immigration forms" at the top. Anyone needing assistance in this process or anyone wondering if they're eligible should contact the Dean of Students and International Student Advisor.
