#### Comments:

- Our increase in our population of M.Div. students is primarily responsible for the slight increase in total enrollment over last year. We see a continued decline in our M.T.S. and Th.M. student population, and this year the number of M.A. students also decreased.
- The high number of M.Div. seniors this year (48, counting the 7 interns) is due to the curriculum changes put into effect the summer of 2007.
- This year's enrollees in the Ecclesiastical Program is nearly identical to that of last year's, considerably lower than the all-time high we experienced in 2005, which likely represented the effect of Synod 2005 decision regarding the changes to this program.
- This year 11% of our student body is Korean, which indicates a continuing decline from the 20% enrolled on average in recent years (last year's was 13%).
- The number of female students continues to be at the lower level that we first saw in 2000, and is more in line with the numbers we saw a decade ago.
- Within the pool of 128 non-CRC students, 65 are international students who represent approximately 25 different denominations, ranging from the African Inland Church of Kenya and a Baptist denomination in Uganda, to the Evangelical Mission Church of Japan and the Christian churches of China, as well as the Presbyterian churches of South Korea and Brazil. All but 5 of our Canadian students are CRC and of these, one belongs to the Church of the Nazarene and another, is Wesleyan. Our non-CRC U.S. students number 58 and they represent denominations ranging from AME-Zion to United Methodist. Included in this group are 15 students who are members of non-denominational churches, 11 who are members of churches within the Presbyterian family, and 12 who are members of churches in the Baptist family.
